
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
HOW WE MAKE A DIFFERENCE

- A specialist liaison nurse will be available to each family referred.
- We assess the child and family's individual needs and set up our service immediately.
- Listen, advocate and help co-ordinate families' wishes.
- We offer a donation towards the cost of in-home respite care for families to source competent nurses/carers.
- We provide a flexible family-centred service.

End-of-Life Care for children 0 - 4 years

- A specialist Children's Nurse will be available to each family referred.
- We offer a donation for up to 80 hours nursing care in a month.
- Nursing care in the home within 24 hours.
- Listen & help co-ordinate families' wishes.
- Daily review of child and family's needs.
- 24-hour crisis care & telephone contact.
- Communicate & liaise with appropriate agencies.
- We facilitate Irish Hospice Foundation
- (IHF) and Health Service Executive (HSE) funding for additional nursing care at home.
- Offer bereavement support and liaise with expert counsellors.
