#### Message from our C.E.O. Carmel Doyle

Our SOS emergency appeal has sustained our service through Covid-19. Thanks to You.

I am glad to report that over 60% of our 362 families are still in receipt of in-home visits. The remainder keep their connection with us via regular phone calls. Community is our delivery ward, with care provided, not over a week or a weekend, but on an ongoing basis, in those critical early years, until the child's 5th birthday. That way, Jack & Jill becomes part of the fabric of the care regime.

Never a charity to sit still, we are running a pilot scheme to extend that service to the age of 6, on a limited and transition basis. We are determined to keep this pilot running into 2021, with a little help from our friends.

## What it's Like to Cocoon with Complex Needs Children

The O'Brien's liaison nurse Mary Joe misses the cuddles and Harry's wonderful laugh, but she realises that the family are grappling with the 'whats ifs' of allowing other people into their home. Mary Joe recently visited the family, but stayed socially distant in the garden. Harry's mum Maria refers to Jack & Jill nurses as her lifeline, allowing them to re-charge their own batteries knowing Harry is well cared for.

Throughout lockdown, Jack & Jill nurses continue to talk to families in person, by phone or through safe distance house calls, keeping that vital connection going.
